Editor in chief of Animal Político. Coordinator of the collaborative project Verificado 2018 that united 90 partners from Mexico's national and state media, civil society organisations and universities. Montalvo has run fact checking and information verification workshops in Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Peru, and Uruguay; as well as in some universities of Mexico, and for various state media. She has headed Animal Político's discourse verification project—the first of its kind in Mexico—, El Sabueso [The Bloodhound], since its creation in 2015. Member of the Poynter Institute's International Fact-Checking Network. She coordinated the news report La Estafa Maestra [The Masterly Swindle]—which reveals the illegal diversion of millions of dollars from federal government's resources through public universities and dummy corporations—that, in 2018, was recognised with El País' Ortega y Gasset Journalism Award, and was a finalist for the Gabriel García Márquez Journalism Award. Montalvo is a graduate in Journalism and Media from Monterrey's Institute of Technology and Higher Studies (ITESM). Some of the outlets for which she has contributed are El Universal, CNN, and Forbes Magazine.
